

<u>A Report on the 160th Annual Convocation of the University of Mumbai</u> <u>Graduation Ceremony of CoHaB's three Early Stage Researchers</u>

The University of Mumbai held its 160th Annual Convocation on the 16th of January, 2017. A total of over 100,000 degrees were awarded out of which 326 were PhD and MPhil degrees. The Governor of Maharashtra & Chancellor of the University of Mumbai, Chennamaneni Vidyasagar Rao was the Chair to the Convocation. The Convocation Address was delivered by the Guest of Honor, industrialist, Mukesh Ambani. The Vice Chancellor, Dr Sanjay Deshmukh delivered a speech about the expansion of the University of Mumbai and the setting up of campuses outside India.
