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Preamble and Objectives

The course is focused on four fine arts –Dramatics (inclusive of acting), Dance, Music, and Painting.Natural talent and systematic training are two equally important elements of good and effective projection of any fine art. Ancient Indian knowledge system is rich with information regarding the basic principles of fine arts. Inclusion of such material in the training /grooming of artists would definitely contribute an extremely beneficial and interesting dimension.
