Diaspora Studies have become a widely established, interdisciplinary field of research and study. This projected talk and discussion will explore where diaspora studies has found its 'canonical' texts, where fields of research are still open or are just in the process of newly emerging, and in which directions new departures could lead diaspora studies in the future.

Prof. Dr. Klaus Stierstorfer is the Chair of British Studies at the University of Muenster, Germany. He studied at the Universities of Regensburg and Oxford, received his D.Phil. from the University of Oxford. He is the initiator of the European Union's Marie Curie ITN project on Diasporic Constructions of Home and Belonging (CoHaB). He is also the Coordinator of the projects on 'Fundamentalism and Literature' and 'Law and Literature'. Some of his important publications are *Beyond Postmodernism: Reassessments in Literature, Theory, and Culture*, *London Assurance and Other Victorian Comedies* and *Women Writing Home 1700-1920: Female Correspondences across the British Empire*.
