#### (4) Procedure for Registration

 Once the list of candidates selected is displayed on the notice board of the department along with the names of the supervisors assigned to them, the candidates are required to write up the final research proposal in consultation with the supervisor, in the prescribed format.

- After the research proposal has been approved by the supervisor, the candidate is required to submit the required copies of the proposal along with the application form duly filled at the Thesis section, University of Mumbai, Fort, Mumbai 32.
- The candidate will be intimated of the approval/request for modification/rejection of the research proposal after the meeting of the RRC.
- The date on which the approval letter is sent from the university is deemed as the date of the commencement of PhD.
