SHORT COURSE on **PHENOMENOLOGY** : Texts in European and Global Contexts **AND CARE**

Theme: This course aims at introducing students, teachers and research scholars to phenomenological debates in ethics, embodiment and language. It endeavors to examine the relationship between phenomenology and care through intersections with enactive ethics and feminism. It also explores the relational dimension of phenomenology through discussions on embodiment. It will further examine the connect between phenomenological accounts of consciousness and Buddhist mindfulness. A significant part of this course will dwell on readings from classic phenomenological texts by Edmund Husserl and Edith Stein in European and global contexts. The sessions will include lectures and interactions. Participants would have to present research papers as a part of their course-work.
