





Revised Syllabus for Diploma Course in French

(with effect from the academic year 2018-19)

Objectives :

COMMUNICATION

This course sharpens the communicative skills already acquired in the certificate course and further builds on them. It develops oral and written skills of understanding, expressing and exchanging information/interacting on the topics given below.

- Describe in detail people, relationships, events, places, cultures of countries
- Compare people, relationships, events, places, cultures and the changes that they have undergone
- Apply for a job
- Exchange personal and professional information
- Express opinion on people, places, events encountered in one's personal life and on press articles, television programmes, multimedia, films, books
- Argue, justify and substantiate a point of view
- Describe hypothetical or imaginary situations
- Express plans, dreams, aspirations of the future

PHONETICS

The course reinforces all the notions introduced in the certificate course

GRAMMAR

The course builds on concepts introduced in the certificate course and further develops the following linguistic skills :

- Pronouns - relative (dont), possessive, indefinite, demonstrative and the use if double pronouns
- Verbs - conjugation of regular and irregular verbs (affirmative and negative) in the following tenses (indicative mood) - past perfect, future perfect
- Verbs - the subjunctive mood (past and present)
- Verbs - conditional (past and present) and gerund forms
- Adverbs of time, place, quantity and indefinite adverbs
- Direct/indirect speech
- Comparative and superlative structures
- Active/passive structures
- Multiple clause sentences - independent clauses joined by coordinating conjunctions, dependant clause (subordinate clause)
- Phrases to express cause, consequence, objective

Textbook : Edito A2- B1 / Alter Ego Plus A2-B1 (subject to availability of books)

Total hours : 160

Diploma is equivalent to CEFRL A2 level

Scheme of examination

Written paper - 100 marks

1. Reading comprehension - 10 marks
2. Translation
French to English - 8 marks
English to French - 12 marks
3. Grammar - 45 marks
4. Vocabulary - 5 marks
5. Composition - 20 marks, 2 short texts of 10 marks each (letter and essay of 70/80 words)

Oral Examination - 50 marks

1. Reading a short passage in French - 10 marks
2. Discussion on given topic - 10 marks
3. General conversation - 10 marks
4. Dictation - 10 marks
5. Listening comprehension - 10 marks

Standard of passing

In order to pass the diploma in French examination a candidate must obtain a minimum of 50 % marks in the written paper (100 marks) and in the oral examination (50 marks) separately and an aggregate of 50 % (= at least 75/150 marks in total)

The final total result will then be scaled down to 100%.
