

CIRCULAR:

All the Heads/Directors of the University Departments/Institutions, Principals/Directors of affiliated colleges/recognized institutions are hereby informed that State Project Directorate, RUSA Maharashtra has informed that there are 43 colleges affiliated to 8 Universities in Maharashtra that have achieved highest grade in three consecutive NAAC cycles and as per the new UGC guidelines on Autonomy (copy enclosed), the need of the Inquiry Committee recommendation on autonomy has been dropped and hence the discretion lie with the Universities. If the Colleges fulfills the criteria of (i) Compliance of Anti Ragging procedures (ii) Promotion of equity in higher education compliance and (iii) Grievance redressal mechanism, the Director, Board of College & University can give Compliance Certificate (format enclosed). Thereafter, eligible affiliated colleges / University Departments has to prepare a proposal as per the UGC guidelines for Autonomous Colleges and acquire the compliance certificate with proofs in attachment. Accordingly, University will issue No Objection Certificate (NOC) which will be submitted to the Secretary, UGC with a copy to the Principal Secretary, State Department of Higher & Technical Education, government of Maharashtra and RUSA State Project Directorate.

It is further informed that in addition, SPD RUSA is organizing a meeting on 23rd September, 2016 at 10.00 a.m. at St. Xavier's College, Mumbai to have a day-long workshop for Management and Principals of the eligible Colleges.

Therefore, in order to make the process result oriented, following timeline is suggested:

- 1. Eligible colleges may submit their proposals alongwith the compliance Certificate to the Director, B.C.U.D. by 23rd September, 2016
- 2. The University Departments to also submit their proposals alongwith a covering letter describing Departments strengths and reasons for seeking autonomous status by 23rd September, 2016.
- Issue of No Objection Certificate to the eligible Colleges/Departments by 30th September, 2016 after receiving the proposals.
- 4. All NOCs to be sent to the UGC with a copy to SPD RUSA by 5th October, 2016.

All concerned Principals/Directors are, therefore, requested to attend the day-long orientation workshop alongwith representatives of Management of your college at St. Xavier's College, Mumbai and also subsequently prepare a proposal as per the UGC Guidelines for Autonomous Colleges (enclosed) and do the needful as per aforementioned schedule.
